This is **not** the general reservations number; rather it gets you to our special group sales office. Leave a message if they do not pick up and they will return your call. Reservations can be cancelled up to 72 hours before your scheduled arrival date without penalty.

Kewpiesta Information

The following will provide you specific information about registering for Kewpiesta and the events we have planned. Items are arranged in the approximate order they occur.

When you arrive, you will want to pick up your registration materials by **registering**. Pick up your registration envelope with your banquet ticket and any other tickets you may have purchased. If you prepaid for centerpiece tickets, these will also be included. Your nametag shows you have registered and is your entry ticket to each of our events.

Your **registration fee** will include your bag, pin, name card (which acts as your ticket to get into members only events), educational workshops/seminars and your banquet ticket. We are aware that some will choose not to attend the banquet. In the event you do not plan to attend this special event, you will be given the option of receiving \$35 in **Kewpie Kash**. Kewpie Kash is non-transferrable and expires immediately following the Saturday Auction. It can be used at the following events: IROCF Garage Sale, IROCF table at Trade Corner, and the Saturday Morning Auction.

Koffee Time: Here's your chance to gather with fellow members over a nice, hot cup of koffee. Remember to bring your own mug, but if you forget, don't despair! We will have disposable cups available as well.

Workshop: Continuing with our Kewpies and railroads theme, come join us to color, cutout, and paste together kewpies on their own Kewpie Railroad Train. Kewpies and train cars will be provided along with glue sticks for placing the kewpies on or in the train cars. Please bring crayons, colored pencils, colored pens, or water color paints; whatever you want to use to color your items along with scissors for cutting out the kewpies. Limited to first 30 participants; small charge.

Ralph Foster Museum and Ice Cream Social: Join us for a self-guided trip through the Ralph Foster Museum, which has a display of Rose O'Neill and Kewpie items on the first floor. There are many more exhibits you may be interested in as well. After your museum visit, we will meet at the Keeter Center for a sweet treat of their homemade ice cream! Yummy!

Garage Sale: About the garage sale.....Our organization has bags, pins, and other items that we have sold over the years. Before these things are offered for sale to the public, we thought we would give our members first crack at purchasing them. Use your Kewpie Kash to help pay for what you buy! The garage sale will pop up from time to time at different events and is unscheduled.

Trade Corner: Sales of Kewpies and Rose O'Neill related items. Tables are \$25 for a 6-foot table. Space is limited and will be given on a first come, first served basis.

Box Lunch: Come join your friends for lunch without having to leave the Westgate! Lunches include your choice of sandwich, chips, water, and other yummy items. The chicken salad is made with BBQ pulled chicken, rich n sassy sauce, mayo, red onion, celery, cheddar cheese, pickles, rib rub. The Club Wrap is just like a club sandwich but wrapped in a tortilla. These lunches will be pre-ordered and *available only through your registration form*.

Annual Business Meeting: **Please bring your membership card** in order to vote on business during our meeting for all current members. Find out what is going on behind the scenes. This is your opportunity to ask questions and get answers. A group photo of members will happen immediately following the meeting. Affiliate Presidents will meet immediately following the photo.

All Affiliate Get Together: This is the time to join other affiliate chapters, buy tickets for drawings, and have fun. Refreshments will be served.

Hidden Treasures: Our time for Show and Tell about your "treasures". Have an item you'd like more information about? Bring it along and ask those in attendance. Find a rare item that no one has seen before? Bring it along to share with fellow lovers of all things Rose O'Neill. Have an item with a special story behind it? Bring it along too!

Doll Kontest: Enter your best dolls in our Doll Contest! See categories and descriptions following the registration materials. It's been a few years since our last Kontest so we thought we'd bring it back!

Education: Please sign up for one or all of these educational sessions. We need counts for handouts (if any) and room set up.

- A History of the Rock Island Railroad (Miles Ehlers) – lecture. Bring stories to share about the Rock Island Railroad.
- Rock Island Ads (Susan Wilson and David Edwards) – lecture with questions and answer session. Susan and Dave will present what they have found on the ads, postcards, and other RIRR items. Their book (limited edition) will be available for sale at registration and after the presentation.
- “Ephemera” –Dave’s 10 Best Discoveries (David Edwards) – lecture with question and answer session. Dave will present what he considers to be the rarest or best items of O’Neill ephemera. Come see if you have any of these items, or find out if you agree with his choices.
- Rose and the Suffrage Movement (Donna Davis) – presentation on Rose O’Neill’s activities as a suffragist. Just two years ago we celebrated the 100th anniversary of the right for women to vote. Come learn what Rose did to help the cause!

Affiliate Dinners: This is the time to join an Affiliate for dinner! Contact your Affiliate to see if they will hold a dinner or join Missouri. The Missouri Mo-Kewps will hold their Affiliate dinner at the Branson Woods. Tickets will be on a first come-first serve basis, but you can sign up through Registration. A waiting list will be compiled if necessary. The menu will include choice of BBQ pulled pork or oven roasted chicken, macaroni and cheese, green beans, cornbread, tea or water and banana pudding for dessert.

Banquet: Our Banquet will be at the Keeter Center at the College of the Ozarks. Seating will be assigned, so please let us know with whom you'd like to sit. The food is excellent! You may choose from the Chicken Chop, a chicken breast with Frenched wing bone wrapped in bacon and served with mushroom ragu, garlic mashed potatoes and green beans, or salmon en croute, Atlantic salmon with Brie cheese and spinach, wrapped in pastry crust and served with chive cream sauce and green beans. Both choices come with a bread, salad and dessert. The Children’s meal consists of chicken tenders, French fries, fruit cup, cookies and milk or apple juice. We will do our best to accommodate any dietary restrictions.

Breakfast – Join us for one last meal together before you head home. The breakfast will consist of breakfast sandwiches, breakfast burritos, muffins, yogurt parfaits, whole fruit, coffee and OJ. Counts are needed before we arrive, so *this is only available with registration*. Although there is a minimal charge for this meal, we gladly accept donations as the price charged does not cover the entire per-head cost.

Registration must be **received** by April 15, 2022. If your registration materials will not arrive by that date, please call Susan Strauss at 303-931-4308 to let her know they are coming and what your choices for meals will be. Those registrations that will be late need to be sent to IROCF, P.O. Box 688, Branson, MO 65615.

Trade Corner Regulations

IROCF Kewpie Trade Korner regulations are as follows:

1. You must be a 2022 paid member of IROCF and have paid the Kewpiesta registration fee.
2. Only 2 persons permitted per space during set up.
3. Items offered must be Kewpie or Rose O'Neill related
4. Vendors requested to give emphasis to offering collectible items.
5. The fee of \$25 per table must accompany this form.
6. Trade Korner ID Ribbons will be in your Kewpiesta Registration packet.
7. You must submit your own Missouri sales tax or have a current sales tax number. This is your responsibility.
8. Please provide the name of any helper when you check in at Registration.

All Affiliate Get Together

IROCF All Affiliate Get Together is scheduled for Thursday, April 28 2022, from 7 pm to 8 pm.

This is the opportunity for Club Affiliates to collect dues, display their drawing items, and sell drawing tickets. Drawing tickets are not to be sold at Trade Korner. There *will be a \$10 fee per affiliate for refreshments*. Affiliates are NOT required to bring refreshments. The person leading the Affiliate should include the fee on their Registration form so we know who to contact in case of any questions.

Doll Kontest Rules

1. All doll entries must be postmarked no later than midnight April 4, 2022. No late entries, substitutions, changes or additions will be accepted after this date. We use the postmark on your envelope, not the date on your check.
2. **Send all entry information** to Susan Strauss, 75620 Carnelian Lane, Indian Wells, CA 92210.
3. **Each entry must be accompanied by \$1.00 fee per doll.** Make checks payable to IROCF.
4. Owners only to deliver dolls to competition room and retrieve at the end of the competition.
5. You must be a 2022 member of IROCF and have paid 2022 Kewpiesta registration fee to enter dolls.
6. Single doll entries only accepted. Entries are limited to ten single dolls per member.
7. Only one doll per sub-classification per member.
8. Entries must include the following information: contestant's name, address, classification of doll entry. Include a brief description and size of each doll. Entries must be typed or legibly printed.
9. Dolls entered by the owner only in person will be accepted. Shipment of doll entries is not permitted.
10. Dolls will be placed under the classification specified by the owner at the time of entry.
11. The committee in charge reserves the right to delete any classes in which there are less than three entries. If a class is cancelled, refunds for those signed up in that class will be given.
12. Owners names may not be any place on the doll entered in competition. Entries may be tagged with small card relating history, marks, etc. Please put dolls on stands where applicable.
13. Judging and show times are printed in the 2022 schedule and will not conflict with other functions. Judging is done on the basis of rarity, quality, and originality. Costuming of doll counts in judging only if it is the original costume.
14. All dolls are entered at owner's risk; neither IROCF or any member of IROCF shall be held responsible. During entry, judging and showing, dolls will be attended by a committee designated for security.
15. Ribbons will be awarded by IROCF in compliance with the decision of the committee of judges. Judges decisions are final.
16. 1st, 2nd, 3rd, and honorary mention ribbons will be awarded where applicable in each classification. A Best of Show, President's Choice and Artistic Merit ribbon also will be awarded.
17. A doll having won a first place in a previous Kewpiesta contest is not eligible for contest entry in 2022.

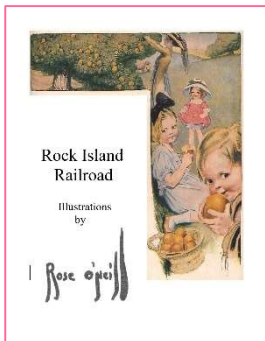
